Q. 52. What are the reasons annexed to the second commandment?

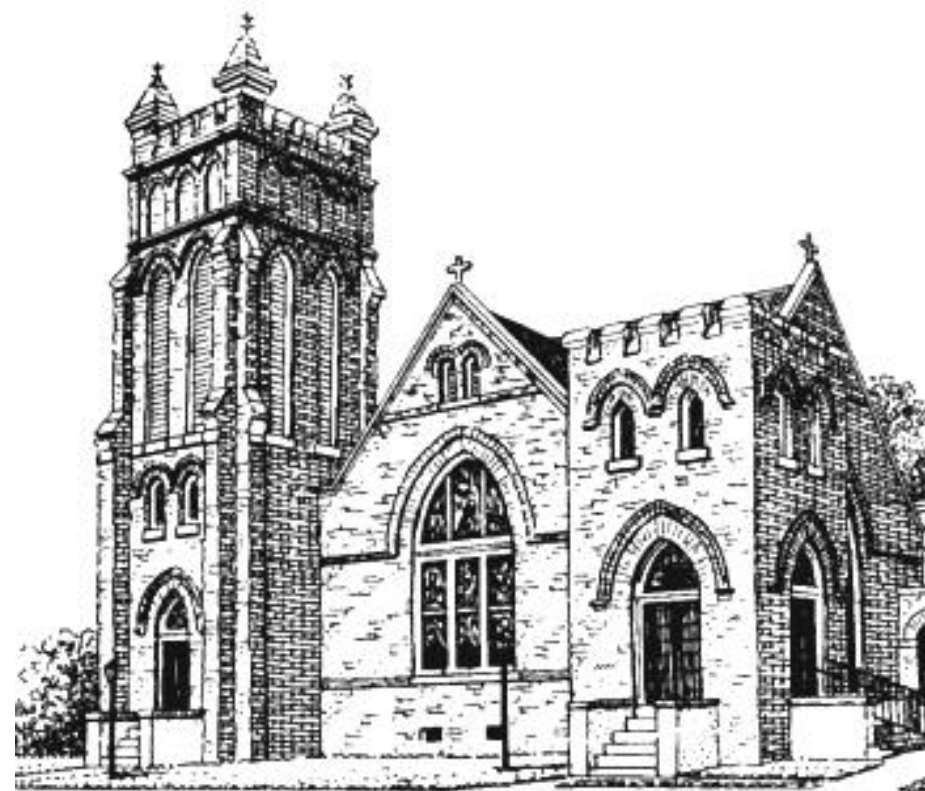
