Be Holy, for I Am Holy

I am fairly confident that the experience of many Christians who desire to read through the Bible sequentially from *Genesis* to *Revelation* comes to a disappointing end when they get to the book of *Leviticus*. The pace, details, and background of *Leviticus* catch many readers unprepared after reading the narratives of *Genesis* and *Exodus*. Consequently, what started off as a noble and beneficial discipline ends in disenchantment and frustration. Moreover, many readers are left with a host of questions about the relevance and purpose of *Leviticus* for the Christian today. What value, if any, do all the laws and statutes about sacrifices and cleanliness have for the Christian anymore? Why was God so particular about how the Israelites related to Him and the surrounding nations? What benefit is there today for Christians in reading and studying this portion of God's Word?

It is my prayer and aim to answer not only these but other questions over the next several months as I preach through *Leviticus* in our worship services. As formidable, and possibly questionable, a task as it may appear, I am excited and honored to minister this portion of God's Word to you, trusting the promises of *Isiah* 55:10–11, "For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it." Here, I want to whet your appetite to the spiritual nourishment that this portion of the bread of life can be for us.

As Paul under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit wrote in *2 Tim*othy 3:16–17, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." The "all Scripture" that Paul had in mind in particular was the Old Testament. Furthermore, *Leviticus* is one of the first five books of the Old Testament that comprise the Torah, the foundation of the Hebrew Bible. Therefore, what Paul, and ultimately God, declares about *Leviticus* is true for us, namely, that it is "profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." In fact, I am trusting that we will indeed be "complete, equipped for every good work" as we mine the depths of *Leviticus* to see its relevance for our lives today. Not only will we be more informed, but I pray that we will be better equipped to serve the Lord and one another.

The most common obstacle that sabotage Christians from capturing the beauty and benefits of *Leviticus* is its historical context. Living as twenty-first century Christians, most of us struggle to understand and assimilate the culture and practices that permeate the setting of *Leviticus*. Furthermore, as we consider the redeeming work of Christ, the issue of continuity between the Old and New Testaments plays a vital role in capturing the progressive nature of God's unfolding revelation throughout redemptive history. The key to unlocking the mystery to this labyrinth is to keep in mind that God, the one who has revealed all of Scripture, is the same yesterday, today, tomorrow, and forevermore, and that the person and work of Christ is the central theme and message of the Bible. If we hold to these two foundational pillars, we can by the grace and help of the Holy Spirit navigate ourselves through many of the challenging passages of *Leviticus* to reach our journey's end of seeing the glory of Christ in this Word.

My prayer for all us through this series is that we will gain a much grander and awe-inspiring view of our God, who in His infinite wisdom and grace has fulfilled salvation for His people in Christ. By studying *Leviticus* as a preparatory blueprint of the salvation that Christ embodied in his ministry, we can see by faith the many applications that it offers to us today. May God bless us richly as we commit ourselves to drinking deeply from the fountain of His Word!
