

Backpack Program for School Year



Can you believe it? Another school year is ready to start and so will our backpack program. This will be our 4th year to participate in this worthwhile ministry. This year we will

again sponsor 10 children and need your help. Our Back-pack Fund was depleted last year and we are in need of monetary donations or supplies.

Suggested food items needed are individual size bags and cans of the following: Grits, Cereal, Milk, Pop Tarts, Cereal Bars, Beanee Weanees, Spam, Spaghetti, Ravioli, Lasagna, Chicken and Dumplings, Mac and Cheese, Tuna or Chicken Kits, Ramen Noodles, Soup, Chips, Peanut Butter Crackers, Cookies, Trail Mix, Fruit Chewies, Rice Krispies Treat, Applesauce, Fruit Cups, Pudding Cups, Juice and 8 oz Bottled Water.

Male and Female He Created Them

In the past 70 or so years in our nation, it seems as though every generation has had to wrestle with some sort of sexual revolution. In the early days, the issue dealt with women's liberation and equality. Later on the movement became more offensive as the mores of society were being toppled by openly promiscuous practices and behaviors. This swelling tide of sexual redefinition has reached a crest so that the fundamental identity of man and woman is being questioned or just ignored. Just in the past 10 years, the LGBTQIA+ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, intersex, and asexual or allied; this is an evolving abbreviation) movement has made such a push on the mainstream of society that it is impossible and irresponsible for the Church to remain silent on this culture-war and spiritual battle. It has and will in even greater measures have serious ramifications for the Church and our ministry and witness to the world.

In light of this growing concern, a special committee was appointed by the moderator of the 2018 General Synod of the ARP to "study whether or not homosexual orientation is morally neutral." At our past General Synod meeting in June, the special committee submitted their study which led to the General Synod adopting a new "Position Statement on Human Sexuality" along with "A Brief Explanation of the Statement" (access it at http://arpchurch.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/07/Human-Sexuality-Position-Statement-2019.pdf). This document is not merely a doctrinal treatise about the immorality of homosexuality but a concise and yet thorough treatment of the Bible's teaching (including our Confessional documents) on sexual identity and its implications. It is a valuable document for all Christians who want to be armed for the battle that will become increasingly volatile in the coming days.

Even as Christians who live in the heart of the "Bible Belt," we are bombarded with an ever-growing pressure to accept the new "norm." Moreover, if we resist or even question the radical social, political, and religious implications of these changes, we are quickly labeled as "bigots," "intolerant," or even "haters." This fundamental issue has already taken captive several of the main-line denominations in the US, including the Presbyterian, Lutheran, Methodist, and Episcopal churches. It is common place now among those groups for openly homosexuals to serve as ministers!

Is it simply a matter of time that all churches, including those who affirm the inspiration of Scripture and its final authority in all areas of faith and practice, eventually buckle under the social weight that appears to be ever increasing? May it never be! God forbid that we forfeit the blessings that our forefathers by the grace of the Holy Spirit fought and even died to pass along to future generations rediscovered during the Protestant Reformation. The authoritative teachings of the Holy Scripture must remain our only standard of truth regardless of what our culture or false teachers may purport. As Bible-believing Christians, we must be armed with its eternal truths amidst an ever-changing culture. It is our duty to know and proclaim God's truth lovingly and courageously to a dying world.

It is with that goal in mind that our next series of study on Wednesday nights will be based on the document adopted by our Synod. I want us carefully to glean from the labors of our ARP brothers what the Bible teaches about human sexuality and what our response should be to our culture, neighbors, friends, and even family. Again, these brothers have done a fabulous job in articulating all the major points of biblical doctrine that lead us to a clear understanding about not only *what* we are to believe but also *why* we should believe what we believe. Having this knowledge will equip us in patiently and logically sharing with others the biblical truth concerning human sexuality.

Instead of retreating from our culture as we see it becoming more and more self-destructive, we as those who have been given Christ's life and light should seize this opportunity to allow the Gospel to shine even brighter. For it is only through the truth and hope of the Gospel that all those who are captivated by this destructive lie will find release and renewal. Please pray and join us on Wednesday night as arm ourselves with the Word of God for such a time as this!



An update from the Brickeys who recently moved from Asturias to Madrid.

- In our first six months in Madrid, Justin plans to connect with ministries as well as continue his support for the elders at the church in Asturias. Pray for him as he walks through Bible/book studies with the elder who is preparing to become pastor of the church in Asturias, and as Justin gets plugged into ministry in Madrid.
- Gillian is directing a camp for the teenage youth whose parents are on the field with World Witness.
 The camp is August 17-23 in France. Justin is serving

as camp chaplain, and we have a wonderful group of counselors and speaker lined up to minister to our youth.

• Gillian just submitted her application for teaching certification for secondary English through ACSI, an international Christian education organization, in preparation to teach at Evangelical Christian Academy outside of Madrid. She is preparing to teach 7th and 8th grade English and serve as an elementary school assistant.
