Disciples of Christ

In the Bible, there are many descriptions for a believer, such as Christian, bondservant, sheep, saint, branch, and pilgrim, just to name a few. We read in the gospels that Jesus referred to the 12 men whom He chose to follow Him *disciples* (*Mt 10:1, Lk 6:13*). A disciple is a student, an apprentice, a person who learns from another. The term disciple was not unique to the 12 apostles. It was used broadly with all those who consistently received Jesus' teaching. Learning from and about Jesus and His will is essential to being a believer. Saving faith requires that a certain set of doctrines be affirmed and embraced. False doctrine will lead to a spurious faith and a questionable salvation.

Christian discipleship means growing in the grace and *knowledge* of the Lord Jesus Christ. Though faith is a gift of God (Eph 2:8), all believers are called to grow in their faith through the ordinary means of grace, in particular the Word of God (1 Pet 2:2-3, 2 Tim 3:16-17). Just as healthy food nourishes and supports the body, God's Word sanctifies the believer's soul when it is received with a humble and genuine heart. Feeding on the Word of God is essential for Christian growth and vitality. As we saw in Acts 2:42-44, one of the distinguishing marks of the flourishing church in Jerusalem was her devotion to the apostles' *teaching*. Moreover, the apostles reiterated the priority of teaching the Word of God as Christ's servants when the crisis of the distribution of food to the widows arose. They wisely set apart the Seven to carry out this ministry so that they could devote themselves to prayer and the *ministry of the word* (Acts 6:4). That is why Christ gifted His Church with the apostles and eventually the pastorteacher for the purpose of equipping "the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes" (*Eph 4:12-14*).

As a church, there are several gatherings when the Bible is taught (weekly sermon, Sunday school, Family Feast, Men's Bible Study, Morning Circle). I hope you are taking advantage of these learning opportunities. The health and growth of a congregation (which is made up of individual members) depend on consuming and obeying God's Word. So, with the desire to expand our church's efforts in proclaiming the Word, the Session has approved a new ministry, the **Newberry Community Bible Study**. Starting Thursday, August 18, from noon to 1 pm, I will teach a weekly Bible study. This study is open to anyone in our community. Since God's Word is effective in maturing a believer's faith as well as instrumental in producing faith - "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (*Rom 10:17*), we are encouraging you to consider inviting and bringing an unbeliever with you who may benefit from this study. As we see more and more of the moral decline in our culture, and even our community, we must devote ourselves as God's people to His Word so that we might continue to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world (*Mt 5:13-14*). As Christ's disciples let us seek to prioritize God's Word in our lives and in our community.


Jubilee Birthday Ice Cream Social


Home-made ice cream sundaes and banana splits will be provided. Please come and join us for a time of sweet fellowship.
