

2-2-20 Initiative

The World Witness 2-2-20 Prayer Initiative is your chance to be part of a new era of missions. Every ARP congregation can experience the joy and sense of purpose found in seeing a missionary called to service from within its ranks.

When an entire congregation daily engages in prayer for God to call a new generation of missionaries, the INESCAPABLE OUTCOME is a thriving congregation involved in next-door and worldwide missions.

Will you be part of this bold embrace of the Great Commission and participate in reaching thousands with the Gospel?

Your Role

PRAY

Pray God would reveal over the next 2 years, 2 individuals, from within your church, whom He is calling to missionary service. This Prayer Initiative, launched at Synod, June 2018 and ending at Synod, June 2020, is meant to raise awareness and passion for reaching the unreached with the Gospel.

IDENTIFY

Currently, there are 274 ARP churches. If each one participates in the 2-2-20 Initiative, the end result could be 2% of the denomination engaged in missions, or perhaps 548 individuals interested in missionary service by 2020.

Once you identify these individuals, commit them to regular prayer. Then, either you, or someone you appoint as the missions mentor, will walk alongside the potential missionary.

Next Steps

EQUIP

World Witness will collaborate with you and/or your missions mentor to equip these individuals by offering a training opportunity. The training will include a suggested schedule of activities that outlines specific strategies to support, encourage and equip those identified as prospective missionaries.

For example, if a child's name is submitted, World Witness can provide information regarding age-appropriate missions-emphasis resources, missionary history curriculums, etc. For teens or young adults, we can provide opportunities in short-term missions, visits with missionaries, vision trips. We can assist in helping you to decide the best avenues of equipping. A bonus for all age groups would be having a World Witness missionary visit your church.

SEND

At the appropriate point in time and age, World Witness will work with you and your church to guide the prospective missionary to the next level. What a joy to be a *sending church*!

- Boldness in encouraging young people to seek God's will for their lives
- The Lord to raise up **missionaries** from your congregation
- Courage to ask "Lord, are you calling me?"
- Strength, protection, anointing for present WW missionaries
- New passion

The Incarnation in Matthew

As we enter another season of Advent, we will take a break from our study of *Ephesians* to focus on the incarnation of Christ. In the coming weeks we will give our attention to the Gospel of *Matthew*. This Evangelist is committed to showing that Jesus is the promised Messiah of the Old Testament. He writes to demonstrate that Christianity is the true fulfillment of the Old Covenant. As believers who look back on the work of Christ, it will help us to deepen our devotion to and wonder of God as we examine the early chapters of Matthew.

God's promise to Abraham was to bless him and all the nations of the earth through his seed (*Gen* 22:18). This promise was ultimately fulfilled in the person and work of Jesus Christ. He was the promised seed who revealed the scope and breadth of God's grand redeeming plan. God's salvation was too glorious to be limited to just Israel. His intention all along was to restore humanity, all the peoples of the earth, to enjoy fellowship with Him once more.

Matthew writes as a Jew who has come to realize that Jesus the Christ is not just the King of Israel but the King of all the earth. He does so not in opposition to the Old Testament but in concert with it. In fact, he quotes the Old Testament 61 times (almost as much as the other three gospels combines) to punctuate this point!

Matthew opens his gospel with a genealogy, but it is not just another ordinary genealogy. He is selective in the names that he includes in the list. His purpose is uniquely tied to his overarching theme of showing how Jesus is both a descendent of Abraham and David. He is the heir of the everlasting kingdom that brings blessing to all the peoples of the earth.

Jesus is not only a descendent of both Abraham and David, but he is the Son of God. In order for God's redemptive purposes to be fulfilled, no ordinary man, a son of Adam, not even a seed of Abraham, was sufficient. None other than the very Son of God, the second Adam, born of a virgin could accomplish this salvation. Jesus, fully divine and fully man, was alone qualified to save His people from their sins. Salvation for "His people" was not limited to the Jews but all the nations of the earth according to God's abundant promises.

The reality of this grand salvation is testified at His birth with the visitation of the wise men from the east. These foreigners were led by a star, a guiding light, to seek the Christ. As they were drawn to the Savior, they worshipped Him with gifts fitting for a King. This child who received homage from worshippers from the east would be the ob-

ject of worship of believers from all the earth.

But before Christ could be worshiped by all the nations, He would need to enter into the sufferings and tribulations of His people. So just as Israel experienced a great deliverance from Egypt via the Exodus, Jesus was also called out of Egypt. His whole life (even the little we know of his childhood) was designed to prepare Him to fulfill our salvation. He was born to die, but not just an ordinary death. Likewise, His life was always in step with His Father's will so that He might the spotless Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. Thanks be to God for keeping and fulfilling all His promises through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!


