

Update from the Session

- 7. The first phase of the Fellowship Hall renovation will be scheduled in December.
- 8. The following men were approved as deacon nominees: Keith Avery, Marc Faulkenberry.
- 9. The December stated Session meeting is scheduled for 6:00 PM on the 20th.

Church Extension in Second Presbytery

Rev. Stacey Cox was approved by Second Presbytery to begin (effective December 1) his exploratory year in Gainesville, GA with the goal of planting Hope Fellowship Presbyterian (ARP). Why Gainesville?


During the first year of the pandemic in 2020, about 27 million Americans moved to a new home. That figure represents a 9% decline from the previous year and is the continuation of a multi-year trend in decreasing mobility rates. However, many major metropolitan areas reported substantial population growth during 2020 and 2021. Gainesville, GA is one of those locations. Located in northeast GA, the population climbed from 203,589 in July 2020 to 207,369 in July 2021. The 1.9% increase ranks as the 37th highest among all U.S. metro areas.

Today, the Gainesville-Hall County Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) is among the top 50 fastest growing metros in the U.S. Total population is over 205,000 with a daytime population in Gainesville, the county seat, exceeding 150,000 people.

Currently, there are only three distinctly Reformed and Presbyterian congregations in the area: one in the city of Gainesville (PCA), one south in Chestnut Mountain (PCA), and a third (PCA) further south which straddles Gwinnett and Hall counties.

Hope Fellowship Presbyterian (HFP) will be targeting the city of Gainesville generally, and I-985/east Gainesville specially.

HFP will seeking to reach persons in the growing medical, educational, and teaching communities in the area, as well as recent newcomers to the community.



Lee Shellnut - Barnabas Ministry



Lee Shelnutt began service as a fulltime missionary in June 2022 for a new field of service. As Discipleship Ministries team leader in Pakistan and Rwanda, he is leading the Barnabas WITNESS Ministry's pastoral and leadership



training programs. For more than 10 years, Lee served World Witness as a volunteer in missions where his work was primarily that of mentoring Pakistani ARP pastors.

Lee previously served as Senior Pastor at Huntersville ARP Church (NC). He is a graduate of Reformed Theological Seminary, Atlanta School of Biblical Studies, and Georgia Tech, and worked in the engineering field with Delta Air Lines. He and his wife, Joni, have a daughter.

Years ago, former WW Director, Rev. Dr. Frank van Dalen, asked Lee to consider mentoring a young Pakistani pastor, Zeeshan Sadia. While this mentorship was limited in its scope, it was a unique type of "Barnabas Ministry" which sought to make a reproducible discipleship ministry for pastors in Pakistan. Lee served as a volunteer, while continuing his pastorate.

However, Lee's heart began to hear a new call, to consider taking this discipleship ministry into a broader, global arena. He sought the advice of several close friends outside his church and World Witness. On the ministry side, this call was divinely related to the massive opportunity the Lord brought WW in Rwanda to teach pastors in need of a certificate to meet government clergy requirements.

In addition to this exciting new role, Lee will be acting as an encourager to our European missionaries who are not part of the Bridge Europe Team. He will help in areas of ministry planning and goals.

MT3 and the Barnabas Ministry

What is different between MT3 and the Barnabas Ministry? While there is overlap in these ministries, they have significant differences as well. Dr. David Galletta, team leader of MT3, works in established seminaries abroad, teaching specified courses to pastors and seminarian students. As such, MT3 team members must have advanced degrees beyond a MDiv. They are meeting a crucial need by teaching courses in a host of countries for which there are no professors with adequate training.

In contrast, the Barnabas ministry will be training, discipling, and meeting the specific needs of pastors in Rwanda and Pakistan. These pastors may not attend seminary but nonetheless must be trained to lead the Church in teaching of the Word and sound ecclesiology. In addition, the Barnabas Ministry seeks to have ongoing, mentoring relationships with church leaders, to further discipleship opportunities.

Regarding overlap, MT3 will be an asset that the Barnabas Ministry will use to fill needs within the discipleship program. Also, academically qualified members of the Barnabas Ministry may be able to assist MT3 in its global course work as well.
