MISSIONS FOCUS







So, whether you are interested in becoming a student at Erskine, being involved in global missions, church planting in the US, or anything else, please join us for World Focus 2018, June 7-8 (**following Synod**) as we look at the present and future kingdom work of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church.

Overcoming Our Spiritual Fear

What is your greatest fear? For Americans, their number one fear is public speaking, glossophobia (74%, Statistic Brain Research Institute, September 4, 2016). If that is not the case for you, I suspect it is pretty high on your list or once was before you overcame it. The thought of embarrassing ourselves before a group of people shakes us to our very core! For some of us, the possibility of experiencing overwhelming shame and humiliation causes our bodies to undergo dramatic and visible changes.

I believe this is one of the natural reasons (along with spiritual forces) why so many Christians are reluctant and even unwilling to share their faith with others. We can all recall more than one occasion in our lives when we walked away from an opportunity to witness or testify about the truth of Christ because we feared how others would react to us. Even in the Bible-belt, it has become more and more unpopular and politically incorrect to speak truthfully about Jesus Christ. So instead of facing public humiliation or scorn, we politely remain quiet!

In reality, this social phobia is not a modern phenomenon or limited to individual with a certain disposition. I can honestly say that even as a pastor, I have felt and succumbed to this pressure in my life. If this is true of you, we stand in good company! I am obviously referring to the apostle Peter who publicly denied the Lord three times. Nevertheless, following the Lord's resurrection, He personally forgave and commissioned Peter to serve Him (John 21:15-19). On the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit filled Peter, and all the other believers gathered in the upper room (Acts 2:4ff), he with newfound boldness and power preached an inspiring sermon that led to the conversion of 3000 souls! What an amazing turn around in such a short period of time.

Through the faithful witness of one of God's servants, the Church grew in size 25 times! In just one day, through Peter's public evangelism, the communion of the saints was visibly larger than it was at any point in Jesus' public ministry. The promise that Jesus gave to His disciples (*John 14:12*) that whoever believes in Him will do greater works than He did was being fulfilled by the Holy Spirit. This same Holy Spirit indwells believers today and is able to use us to add souls to the Kingdom.

Evangelism, the faithful proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, is the Lord's primary and ordinary means of grace for enlarging the invisible church, the visible church, and the Newberry ARP Church. As thankful as we are for covenant children making a profession of faith as they mature in the church, there are so many more souls in our community who need to hear and respond in faith to the good news of Jesus Christ. Moreover, the longevity and vitality of our church are directly linked to this necessary expression of our faith. If we are not diligent and persistent in leading new converts to Christ and into our membership, it will only be a matter of time before the lampstand on the corner of Main and Calhoun is extinguished.

But this is where the fear we mentioned above comes into conflict with the responsibility of evangelism. As much as we agree with the need to evangelize, most of us are held captive by our fears when confronted with the task. Though not an excuse by any means, it appears that within Presbyterian churches the spiritual gift of evangelism is a rare commodity. We must, therefore, lean all the more on the superabundant grace of the Holy Spirit to equip and empower us in this service. It must not be the

work of a few, but the faithful and winsome call of us all.

So where do we go from here? There have been many books written about evangelism and many programs developed to train Christians in evangelism. You may have read some of these books or have undergone such training or both. Despite having done one or both, you find yourself still lacking in your evangelistic efforts and zeal. The truth is that no book or program can be a substitute for prayer and the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Apart from the Holy Spirit changing our hearts so that our love for lost sinners is greater than our fears of being rejected or humiliated, we will always yield to our stronger affections. Unless we prayer earnestly and consistently for the Holy Spirit to take our meager abilities and efforts and use them to awaken dead hearts to the glory of Christ, all our labor is in vain.

So on the one hand, we face an insurmountable task; one that makes us feel helpless and illequipped. But on the other hand, we can pursue the lost with patience and confidence knowing that the Holy Spirit is mighty to save. As it is the case with so much of the Christian life, it is not about what we can do or what we have but about trusting the Lord and His grace to fulfill His purposes in and through us.

Therefore, I invite you as we begin (starting January 31) a new Bible study on Wednesday nights to join me and your fellow members as we learn and pray for God to make us more effective and faithful evangelists. To aid us in this effort, I will be basing my teaching on the book Learning Evangelism from Jesus by Jerram Barrs. Church historian and theologian David Wells writes concerning this book, "This is not a book about evangelistic technique but about doing evangelism biblically. There is a difference! Beginning with some of the everyday scenes in the gospels and then examining some of the parables, Jerram Barrs shows us that Jesus had no wooden formula which he followed, but rather was about engaging people in the depths of their being. As a result, this is an unusually wise guide to doing evangelism. The great truths of the gospel shine forth undiminished while at the same time the recesses of the human heart are explored with real insight."

I am looking forward to seeing how the Lord might change you and me to be soul winners for Him. It will not be easy or inviting, but Gospel transformation is glorious and always rewarding. The fruit that can be born from these times of study and prayer are eternal. So please make the effort to gather with us on Wednesday nights.
