

Who Am I?

One of the primary themes in Luke's gospel is the *identity* of Jesus. Various individuals have asked the question, "Who is this man?" Fortunately, Luke throughout his gospel clearly reveals that Jesus is none other than the Son of God, the Christ. His life of perfect obedience, substitutionary death on the cross, victorious resurrection, and glorious ascension all testify to His identity. Furthermore, because Jesus had no doubts about His identity, His life and actions were consistent with the Father's will. As Luke points out, there is an unmistakable correlation between identity and function, purpose and action.

But how would you answer that same question, "Who are you?" More than likely, depending on who asked that question and what the context was will affect how you answer that question. We all wear many hats, and depending on which hat we are wearing at the time the question is asked will determine the particular details of our answer.

So then more specifically, how would you answer that question if it was asked of you at church? I'm sure there would be a variety of answers from person to person, but one way in which you could all answer that question consistently and accurately would be to base your answer on the questions taken from our *Form of Government (FoG)* concerning communicant membership. These questions identify the core beliefs and convictions that define who you are as a member of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church (not just to the local congregation in Newberry but of the whole denomination!).

As a way of encouragement (like looking into a mirror), let me remind you all what these questions (FoG 4.5, A.) are so that you can be more confident in your identity as a church member of the ARP.

- (1) Do you confess that you are a sinner in the sight of God; that you deserve His punishment; that you are unable to save yourself; and that you are without hope of salvation except for God's love and mercy?
- (2) Do you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and the Savior of sinners; and do you receive and trust in Him alone for your salvation?
- (3) Do you accept the Bible, comprised of the Old and New Testaments, as the written Word of God; and that it is the only perfect rule of faith and how to live [practice]?
- (4) Do you promise to trust in the guidance and strength of the Holy Spirit so that you can live all of life as a Christian, following the example set by Jesus Christ?
- (5) Do you promise to exercise faithful stewardship of God's resources entrusted to you for the furtherance of God's Kingdom and purposes?
- (6) Do you accept that the doctrines and principles of the Standards of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church are founded upon the Scriptures?
- (7) In loving obedience, do you submit yourself to the government and discipline of this church, promising to seek the peace, purity, and prosperity of this congregation as long as you are a member of it?

These question are not meant to be exhaustive nor comprehensive. Rather, they establish the common convictions upon which certain Christians can identify and work together to build the Church of Jesus Christ on the earth. They provide the foundation upon which a local congregation can strive together to glorify God as a worshipping community in this world.

Over the next several months, I would like for us to review and reflect upon these questions to better equip and unite us for the task that awaits us in the coming, namely, **growing together in maturity and number**. It is the prayer and aim of your session to discuss and plan how we might be more proactive as a congregation in being a more healthy and vibrant congregation. That will require some measure of internal fortification but also a greater measure of outreach into our community. What all this will look like and how it will move forward are a matter of much prayer, so pleas pray for your session. In the meantime, it would behoove us all to know *who* we are as church members so that our *identity* will guide our *actions* to the praise of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



Featured Missionaries – Jeff and Lisa King



Jeff and Lisa King were appointed as missionaries with World Witness in 2010. After completing language school in 2013, they moved to Quilpué, Chile, and worked in partnership with Youth for Christ (YFC). While there, they helped reopen a youth center in a low-income community. Children and youth came to the center for weekly English classes, soccer games, and a Bible Club. In August 2015, the Kings transitioned from Chile to Spain. Jeff teaches English at Evangelical

Christian Academy (ECA), a Christian international school outside Madrid. ECA is an English speaking school and Jeff is providing his students support so they can be successful. He works with both missionary kids as well as students who come from unbelieving homes. He is also the elementary chaplain leading all the elementary students in a chapel service twice a month.
