



Featured Field - Pakistan



Located in southeast Asia, it is a predominately Muslim country. More than 98% of the people living in the country have not heard and accepted the Gospel Message. Less than 1% of the population is Christian. Unfortunately, there are many obstacles to sharing the Gospel in Pakistan. Much of the country is rural and illiterate. Because Islam is the official religion of the country, Christians often face opposition in their work.

Praises

- Christian Hospital Sahiwal has been approved to offer a 4-year BSN Program.
- Renovations being made at the ARP Christian School for additional boys and girls.
- Hospital staff have opportunities to pray with those receiving medical treatment.
- Children are receiving a Christ-centered education.

- For the health and safety of the missionaries serving in Pakistan.
- That God would lead more missionaries to take the Gospel to the Pakistani people.
- For doctors to serve at Christian Hospital Sahiwal.
- For teachers to serve in the ARP Mission Schools.

Report of the 2018 General Synod Meeting by Andre Jennings

The 214th Annual meeting of the General Synod of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church was a tremendous blessing. I was reminded of the blessing it is to serve in Christ's Church. The worship and singing at the beginning of each business meeting were beautiful and uplifting. The second day of Synod began with a sermon led by Pastor Andrew Di Iulio of the Devenger Road Presbyterian Church. After a short recess, we heard from the PCA Fraternal delegate who brought greetings and gave an update of ministries in their church.

Business began with the Special Committee to Revise the Book of Discipline. After much discussion, their recommendations were not approved by the court. Instead a substitute motion to refer the document for review to the Committee on Theological and Social Concerns was approved. The next order of business were the recommendations from the special committee on the 2019 Synod Logistics that will be held in conjunction with the RPCNA in Beaver Falls, PA on June 11-13. All the recommendations were approved. The Special Committee on Directory of Private/Family Worship recommended that the Moderator of General Synod appoint a committee to produce a new "Directory of Private and Family Worship" was approved. The recommendations from the Special Committee on Domain Names were approved which authorized Central Services to trademark the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church name, along with simple variations of the ARPC name, and the ARPC logo. Following this, the delegates watched a video produced by the Committee on Campus Ministry Oversight which highlighted the expansion of the RUF Ministry in the ARP which now includes Rev. Josh Grimm at Queens University of Charlotte, Rev. Scott Andes at the University of South Carolina, ministering specifically to international students, and Rev. Paul Patrick at Erskine College. The General Synod approved the recommendations from the committee on Inter-Church Relations which included sending fraternal delegates to the OPC, RPCNA, EPC, EPCEW, and EPCI to their General Assemblies later this summer. The Synod received and approved the recommendations from the Committee on Investment followed by the approval of the recommendations from the Minister and His Work committee as well as the Committee on Worship. Rev. Mike Jones updated the Synod on new church development and the vision of Outreach North America for continued growth of our denomination. Currently, ONA is supporting 12 new church developments in 7 presbyteries along with exploring additional fields for 2019. After much discussion on their budget, all of their recommendations were approved.

After lunch, the Synod reconvened, and worship was led by Rev. John Paul Marr giving a message on Isaiah 7:1-9. Following the message, greetings were brought by the fraternal delegate from the OPC and a prayer was offered on behalf of the OPC. Business resumed with the recommendations from the William H. Dunlap Orphanage being approved. Dr. Leslie Holmes, Provost for Erskine Seminary, presented the Synod with an update of the Seminary and the plans for a extension campus in Greenville, followed by a report by Dr. Gustafson, president of Erskine College. All the recommendations from Erskine College and Theological Seminary were approved. The recommendations from the Board of Stewardship, the Executive Board, and Bonclarken were all approved. Mr. Alex Pettett, Executive Director of World Witness, introduced Rev. Zeeshan Sadiq who spoke of the work of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in Pakistan, giving an update on the state of the ARP in Pakistan. Mr. Pettett also presented his report and World Witness' vision of "2-2-20" where WW is asking for every ARP church to submit 2 names of 2 potential missionaries to WW by 2020. The other recommendations from WW were also approved by the Synod.

Synod reconvened for the evening in the Chapel where Rev. Clint Davis preached a message from Joshua 1. Greetings were then brought by the fraternal delegate from the RPCNA. Business resumed with a memorial presented by First Presbytery requesting that the Synod study the nature of authority as it relates to the Diaconate. This was approved by the court. First Presbytery also presented a memorial to establish a New Eastern NC Presbytery which will be comprised of 16 churches and 5 church plants in western North Carolina. All the recommendations in this memorial were approved.

Some of the other significant motions approved included: removing the president of the Alumni Association as a voting member of the Erskine Board; Leslie Holmes, Provost of ETS, elected as Moderator Elect, and Rob Roy McGregor, III, an elder at Back Creek ARP Church in Charlotte, NC as Vice Moderator Elect.
