No, Lord! Don't Send Me!

Starting June 10, we will begin a new preaching series on the book of *Jonah*. Even if it has been some time since you have read *Jonah*, I'm sure you have some vivid images in your mind related to this book. It is one of the most memorable stories in the Bible. How could anyone ever forget about the three days that Jonah spent in the belly of a great fish and then being vomited out upon dry land! It is a classic tale of God's authority and mercy.

But what is there in *Jonah* for us to learn and live by today? What truths and applications can we draw from this book for our present lives? Fortunately, the significance and implications of *Jonah* are as vital today as ever. My prayer is that the Lord will use these messages to reinvigorate our vision of who God is and how that glorious truth affects our relationship with Him.

As we engage our hearts and minds to this portion of God's Word, I trust that we will be captivated not by just the enormity of the fish that swallowed Jonah but more importantly the wonder of God's power and mercy. Not only does the Lord control the wind and the waves, and the great beasts of the sea, but He moves with even greater force to draw sinners to Himself.

The grace with which the Lord acts to save the rebellious Ninevites is matched by His efforts to soften Jonah's heart for the salvation of his enemies. Not only does God long to see the nations gathered to Himself, he longs to see his prophet, and His people, share the message of salvation with the lost. These are the same precious truths that need to be worked into our hearts today. We desperately need to have our hearts opened to the lost in our world, in our community today. Our longing to see God's saving mercies applied to even our enemies need to be awakened in our hearts.

The book of *Jonah* serves as a mirror for the heart of many congregations in America today. It reveals the callous and even antagonistic attitude that she has towards the lost world, unbelieving sinners. In many ways, instead of obeying God's command to go to Nineveh, she has boarded a ship headed in the opposite direction. Instead of having a heart of compassion and mercy for the lost in reaching out to sinners, many churches have retreated into her comfortable facilities attending to her own priorities. Instead of shining her light for the world to see, she is tempted to put it under a basket preoccupied with serving herself.

How will we as a congregation fare in light of God's truths in *Jonah*? Will we be responsive to the preaching of God's Word as the Ninevites or will we be reticent like Jonah to God's fatherly discipline? God revels in revealing His mercies, whether it be to unbelievers in bringing them to faith or to His children in sanctifying them in grace. In both instances, God reveals His unrivaled goodness and greatness.

Pray with me that the Lord will work in each one of our hearts to use these messages to make us more like Christ who came to seek and to save those who are lost. Pray for the Lord to show you who your "Nineveh" might be and then to grant you the compassion and courage to serve them with the gospel. Pray for the Lord of the Harvest to send us out in His harvest!
