Church Membership: A Privilege and a Responsibility

Back in the late 1980's to mid 1990's, American Express trademarked the slogan, "Membership has its privileges," to market their unique credit card that charged a fee in contrast to their rivals like Capital One, Discover, MasterCard, and Visa that did not. They claimed to offer consumers certain advantages that the other competitors did not. With their exclusive membership that came with the annual fee, they sought to earn additional revenue above and beyond the typical interest levied on the borrower. It was a novel idea that sought to leverage the perceived benefits that an exclusive "membership" offered. American Express launched this campaign with the hope that there were enough consumers who would be willing to pay an additional fee to belong to this privileged membership.

Whether or not this was a successive campaign remains to be seen, but the principle of *a membership that costs noting is worth nothing* is a truth that applies to the church of Jesus Christ as well. To even use the word *membership* in the same sentence with the *church* may seem like a foreign concept to many Americans today, but when we faithfully read and understand the Bible, church membership is revealed all throughout Scripture. Even if the term "church membership" is not found in the Bible, it is a concept that has its roots in Old Testament Israel. In fact, for certain transgressions against the Lord's covenant, God required that such offenders be "cut off" for his people (*Gen 17:14; Ex 12:15, 19; 30:33, 38; Lev 17:9-10* just to mention a few). In essence these violators lost their membership in the visible church, the people of God.

In the New Testament, Jesus in John 15 uses similar language to describe what He does with those branches that do not bear fruit. These branches that are cut off are removed *from* the vine which implies that they were connected or joined to Christ and the visible church. It is a process that takes into account the privileges as well as the responsibilities of being a professing Christian and a church member and living in accordance with that identity. Moreover, in *Matthew* 18:15-20 Jesus gives clear instructions on how an unrepented church member is to be treated. When the offender is unwilling to repent after multiple attempts at restoration, the church is to treat him as a Gentile and a tax collector. In other words, he is to be *removed* from the membership of the church. Likewise the apostle Paul clearly alludes to the reality of church membership when he rebukes the Corinthian church for not removing a scandalous sinner from among them (1 Cor 5:2-5; 13). Their unwillingness to expel the church member called into question the honor of Christ and the witness of the church. Furthermore, Paul formalized church membership to the extent that he instructed Timothy (1 *Tim* 5:9-16) to keep a separate record (*enroll*) of certain widows who would be supported by the church. A definitive church membership has always been a mark of the people of God.

Being a church member comes with many spiritual and temporal benefits. We may take some of them for granted but the effects of the coronavirus in 2020 have brought many of them to the surface. Therefore, church membership necessarily includes responsibilities. To truly benefit from our membership, we must also be diligent to exercise the responsibilities of a healthy member. As a helpful summary, the ARP Form *of Government* (4.4) lists the responsibility of church members as: "A. Make diligent use of the means of grace. B. Share faithfully in the worship and service of the Church. C. Give of their substance as the Lord may prosper them. D. Render wholehearted service to Christ and His Kingdom throughout the world. E. Continue in the peace and fellowship of the people of God. F. Submit to the authority of the elders. G. Live so as to bear faithful witness to the Gospel."




Our theme Scripture for 2021: "And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." Acts 4:12 (CSV)




