

The Sword of the Avenger

But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. - Romans 13:4b

In a God-ordered society, those who live in compliance with God's law need not fear the civil authority. However, for those who reject God's law, they should expect to suffer God's vengeance through His servant. The fear of God's wrath for persistent wrongdoers is a mercy designed to warn and to deter them from continuing on their destructive path.

The fear that persistent wrongdoers experience is a product of the human conscience (Rom 2:15). Most fallen sinners (except for those whose consciences have been "seared") still have within them the desire to avoid punishment. Thus, Paul commands the wrongdoer to be afraid so that they might stop walking along that destructive path before it is too late! This God-given fear of punishment serves as a safeguard from harming others and even oneself.


In order to prevent or limit the damage that a wrongdoer might inflict on others, God has armed His servant, the civil authority, with the authority to punish the evildoer. The "sword" that Paul references in this verse is a symbol that represents the legitimate and righteous use of force. This sword's purpose is authorized by God. Not all wrongdoing deserves death (the ultimate punishment of the sword), but if necessary, the civil authority has been authorized by God to enforce capital punishment (Gen 9:6). The sword can be used by God's servant to execute a wrongdoer who has sinfully taken another person's life.

The civil authority has been instituted by God to serve as His temporal representative in carrying out retributive justice. They are to punish lawbreakers in proportion to their wrongdoing. Lesser offenses ought to be punished less severely than more severe offenses. In wielding the sword with wisdom, righteousness, and impartiality (according to the truth and principles of the Bible), God's servant protects the innocent and those who do good while dissuading and deterring would-be wrongdoers from perpetrating evil and punishing those who have done wrong.

Unfortunately, in a fallen world justice will not be administered perfectly. Not all governing authorities are righteous or seeking to promote the good. Therefore, it is not rare that the innocent suffers unjustly or the wrongdoer escapes judgment. Until the Day of Judgment, when the Righteous Judge makes all things right, we will see the abuse of the sword by those in authority. Depending on how biblical the civil authority is will greatly determine the manner in which he wields the sword. Moreover, the degree to which a society has been transformed by the church will also determine how judiciously the governing authorities wield the sword.

Since we live in a post-Christian society that is increasingly becoming anti-Christian, it will not be uncommon for the civil authority to abuse the use of the sword. When this happens, God's servant is acting out of character. Nevertheless, we can be assured that God will judge all such renegades, if not in this life, certainly in the life to come. As we seek to honor God in this life, we need not fear the sword for our lives are ultimately secure in Christ!
