






Until He Comes

Last month we considered the present dimension of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper in our corporate worship. This month we turn our attention to the future aspect of the Lord's Supper. When you are participating in the Lord's Supper, how often do you reflect on your future with the Lord? If you are not, you are missing out on and limiting the benefits that our Lord intended for this means of grace to have for believers. Just as our Christian faith involves a past, present, and future dimension, so too does this sacrament.

The foundation for this teaching comes directly from the mouth of our Lord Jesus. On the night when Jesus instituted this sacrament, he revealed to his disciples a future time when he would be reunited and share this meal with them again: Luke 22:16, 18 "For I tell you I will not eat it **until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God**. For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine **until the kingdom of God comes**." (cf. Luke 22:30; Matt 26:29; Mark 14:25). Jesus clearly had in mind a future time when he would celebrate this meal with his followers when the kingdom of God was consummated. This day, even for us, is yet to come. We look forward to a day when all things will be made new in the kingdom of God.

However, Jesus' teaching about the kingdom of God was not original to him (*Matt* 22:1-14; 25:10). Faithful Israelites who knew the Scriptures likewise looked forward to the fulfillment of this glorious reality: *Isa* 25:6–8 "On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a **feast of rich food**, a **feast of well-aged wine**, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined. And he will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations. He will **swallow up death forever**; and the Lord God **will wipe away tears from all faces**, and the **reproach of his people he will take away from all the earth**, for the Lord has spoken." The language that Isaiah uses in this prophecy clearly points to a day that was beyond Jesus' earthly ministry. Even though Jesus declared that "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel," (*Mark* 1:15) there was much more that needed to be realized. Jesus ushered in the kingdom by demonstrating his powers over Satan in his public ministry and confirmed his victory over sin and death in his resurrection, but the consummation of Isaiah's prophecy was still beyond the horizon.

The apostle Paul was well aware of this tension ("the already, but not yet"). Despite the fact that Christ's victory over sin, Satan, and death was decisive and monumental, the fullness of Christ's redemptive work was yet to come. This future aspect of the coming kingdom is evidenced in his teaching about the Lord's Supper. In 1 Corinthians 11 where Paul teaches extensively on the Lord's Supper, he summarizes the effect of our participation in it with these word: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes (1 Cor 11:26). In the words, "until he comes," we clearly sense a future aspect of the Lord's Supper. Paul's point is that whenever we celebrate this sacrament, we testify to a future event, a day that is to come. In receiving this sensible sign and seal of the covenant of grace, we are embracing the promises of a coming King with his kingdom.

In the book of *Revelation*, the consummation of this promise is expressed as a glorious wedding banquet: 19:7–9a "Let us rejoice and exult and give him the glory, for the **mar-riage of the Lamb has come**, and his Bride has made herself ready; it was granted her to

clothe herself with fine linen, bright and pure— for the fine linen is the righteous deeds of the saints. And the angel said to me, Write this: Blessed are those who are invited to the **marriage supper of the Lamb**." On this day, the Church, the Bride (*Eph* 5:25ff), will be forever wed to her Husband, Christ the Lamb of God, which is cause for a great celebration. It will be a day when our faith will become sight. A day when all our hopes in Christ will be realized.

But until that day, our present participation in the Lord's Supper is but a foretaste of the wedding feast. For now we partake of Christ at the Table in token measure, but when he returns we will feast at the wedding banquet until our cup overflows. Therefore, each time we proclaim our Lord's death in the Supper, we are also affirming our hope in his glorious return. Until that day, our hope is to be invigorated as we long for our salvation associated with His return (*Heb* 9:28). In God's wisdom and grace, the Lord's Supper serves to wet our spiritual appetites for heaven. May we with anticipation and joy avail ourselves to all that God has in-store for us in this heavenly celebration.
