Below is a summary of the actions taken by the elders at the April stated meeting:

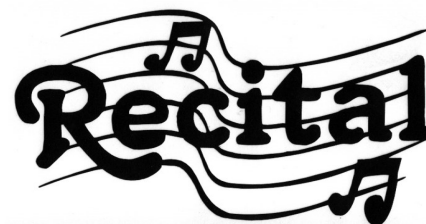
1. The March Diaconate minutes were reviewed.

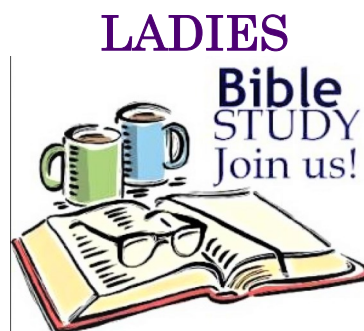

## MISSIONS FOCUS

### Featured Field – United Kingdom/England



According to the 7<sup>th</sup> Edition (2010) *Operation World*, England has a population of 51,460,000. It is the most secular of the four countries that comprise the UK. The steady decline in belief and church attendance is of deep concern. Only 6% of people regularly attend church; those who do attend rarely engage with the unbelieving majority. Notional Christianity (individuals who identify themselves as Christian yet do not meet the criteria for being "born again") is giving way to atheism as the main barrier to true faith; the trappings of inherited cultural forms of Christianity are being discarded. This presents both a great challenge and a new opportunity for a fresh start to the re-evangelization of England. Pray that the Holy Spirit may break into lives and bring a sense of the reality of God and the truth of the gospel.

### Michael and Laura Cochran



In January 2018 the Lord sent Rev. Michael Cochran, and his wife and son - Laura and Fox, to Cheltenham, England. As missionaries of World Witness, they came to acclimatize for a couple of years to life in the UK, with the intention of then moving on to help in church planting. Michael immediately proved to be a great help in the setting up of Oxford Evangelical Presbyterian Church ([www.oxfordpres.co.uk](http://www.oxfordpres.co.uk)) by designing the website, helping shoot promotional videos, and being an all-round great guy. It soon became clear that Oxford would be an ideal

place for them to move to and help in the planting of this church, and so late last year it was agreed for them to start pushing the necessary doors to make this happen. It is hoped that sometime this summer they will be able to do just that – move to Oxford and help in the ministry of the church. Please pray for them as the cost of living in Oxford is substantially higher than in Cheltenham and so they need to increase their financial support before coming here.
