

A Minster of a Congregation in the ARP Church

The final question in our *Form of Government* asked of a potential member is, "In loving obedience, do you submit yourself to the government and discipline of this church, promising to seek the peace, purity, and prosperity of this congregation as long as you are a member of it?" There are two words in this question that may require a bit of explanation, especially for those who are not from the ARP or another Presbyterian denomination, namely, *church* and *congregation*. Often these words are used interchangeably but that is not the case in this question. As I have explained to many whom I've interview for membership, these words have distinct meanings within our ecclesiology and polity, system of church government.

The word *congregation* refers to the local assembly of Christians in a particular fellowship, i.e. all the members of the Newberry ARP Church or any other ARP church. On the other hand, *church* refers to the ARP denomination. It includes the members of every ARP congregation and the ministers of each presbytery (a minister is a member of a presbytery not a congregation). This is not just a matter of splitting hairs or semantics but it strikes a chord at what we believe about the church, namely, it is connectional.

Presbyterians believe that the Bible teaches that there is a vital connection between local congregations. Each congregation is a member of the body, the church. This organic unity amongst congregations in the ARP Church serves a theological and ministerial purpose. The Westminster Standards (Confession, Larger and Shorter Catechisms) summarize what we believe to be the foundational doctrines of the Scriptures . Ministers and officers (ruling elders and deacons) in the church are required to affirm these doctrines as their own. Likewise, when presbyteries and Synods ratify a decision, it has ramifications on every congregation. The Presbytery serve the congregations just as Synod serves the Presbyteries.

As an ARP minister, not only does my membership reside in a presbytery (our is Second Presbytery), but I also have responsibilities related to the various committees and boards of presbytery and Synod on which I might serve (this is true of ruling elders as well). Currently, I serve on the Church Extension Committee of Second Presbytery and the Inter-Church Relations Committee of Synod. Furthermore, because I serve as the chairman of the Church Ex. Comm., I also have a seat on the Outreach North America Board of Synod.

In the coming weeks, I will be away for two of these committees serving the ARP Church. In my absence, I would ask you to pray for the work that might be accomplished for they will invariably have some effect on this congregation. In so doing, may the Lord grant you to cherish the grandeur of His Kingdom at work through the ARP Church.

MISSIONS FOCUS

Featured Field – PAK7

PAK7 is a media ministry by and for Pakistani Christians supported by Christians from



VISION: To see: 1) God more fully glorified and enjoyed 2) His church built up in the knowledge of God, the appreciation of the gospel and the fulness of the Holy Spirit and 3) Pakistan transformed by God's love.

MISSION: To provide the Pakistani Church an opportunity to witness to Jesus Christ and the gospel through inspirational, informational, and educational media services.

What does PAK7 mean? The word "pak" means "holy, pure, and clean" in Persian and Urdu. Seven is both the number of territories in Pakistan and the number of completion or perfection in the Bible.

History: In 2009, 50 Pakistani church leaders and media ministry workers gathered in Lahore for a media ministry consultation hosted by RZIM (Ravi Zachary international Ministries). These leaders made a recommendation that the church and the various agencies and workers needed to have some way to work together collegially.

About the same time World Witness began prayerfully to search for a way to continue its work in Pakistan at: a time when most of its American missionaries had returned from the field. In 2013, WW authorized board member Gordon Bell to conduct feasibility studies to determine the viability of a "John 17" type of media ministry (various branches of Christ's Church put aside secondary differences in order to carry out her commission in the manner envisioned by Jesus in John 14-17) following the successful model of SAT-7.

Accordingly, in 2014 Bell held a follow-up Media Ministry Consultation in Lahore at which he posed the question of whether adapting this "John 17" model for Pakistan might meet this need to have a way by which the various media ministries and workers could work together. The response was enthusiastically and unanimously affirmative. At a second Consultation in Lahore in 2016, the Pakistani leaders began the process of developing the coalition by agreeing on a Statement of Values and the terms of Partnership. A Working Group composed of Pakistani and global church leaders began to meet monthly between 2017-2018 via a secure video link to do the necessary collaborative groundwork to establish the coalition.

In early 2018, PAK7 US was incorporated, and in August, Andrew Hart was called to be the founding CEO of PAK7. In October, Charter Meetings were held in Lahore and London to establish PAK7 International, and the first PAK7 International Council was announced. The Council held its initial meeting, and many delegates signed the London and Lahore Declaration, committing themselves to making the Christian message known in Pakistan.





Ken and Jerri began service with World Witness in 1981, serving among the Muslim Vai tribe of Liberia from 1983-1991 and in Pakistan from 1993-1999. From 2009-2019, WW sponsored the Lotzes in the ARPConnect ministry. Based in Charlotte, NC, Ken assisted the ARPConnect team, focusing on mobilizing the church to effective discipleship among Muslims living in North America. In 2019, Ken was appointed by WW as Vice President for Partner Relations (USA) for PAK7. Ken grew up in Pakistan, graduated from California State University, and has seminary degrees from Fuller School of World Mission in California and Erskine Seminary, with further graduate studies in Economic Development from Eastern University in Pennsylvania. Jerri graduated from California State University, has a Masters in Education from Wingate University, and has taught at Los Angeles Baptist High
