

Michael & Laura were approved as full-time missionaries with World Witness in 2017 for ministry in church planting and revitalization in England. That same year, Michael



was ordained as a minister in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian denomination. In 2018, they moved to Cheltenham, England, serving two EPC churches. In 2020, they began working with a new church plant in Gloucester, England. Within a year, Michael

was commissioned by the Presbytery of the EPCEW as the minister of Gloucester EPC. The Cochrans are passionate about hospitality ministry and about seeing the Great Commission fulfilled through the work of the local church. They have one son, Fox.

Recent Update

When we arrived in the US in late May, we hit the ground running! We had a wonderful time being at Bonclarken in June for the annual ARP Synod meeting and the special World Focus missions conference. Since that time, we have been traveling all around the US, visiting with friends and churches and sharing stories about the work in England. In years past, these presentations would be about our vision for church planting overseas and our dreams of what could be. It has been refreshing and encouraging this time around to be able to share a first-hand account of the amazing works of the Lord in the UK over the last five years of ministry. .

As we look back over our busy summer, we are encouraged by the connections we have made with so many of you, our friends and supporters! Over the summer our travels have taken us all around North and South Carolina, up to Maryland and Virginia, and down to Georgia and Florida and back up again. We calculated something like 3,000 miles for these trips, and that's only the first half of our home ministry assignment!


Would you continue to pray for us? We miss our church family in England. We miss Biscuit (pet dog, she is being cared for by a trusted friend in our house in England). Even though there has been a lot of good, we have also had some heartache while being here in the US.

What's our current financial need? We are currently in need of approximately \$850 per month in recurring giving through monthly partnerships. In addition to this, we also are in need of one-time gifts totaling around \$14,000 to replenish the funds that were depleted earlier this year by our permanent residence application and house move.

When do we head back to the UK? We fly back to England on January 4. Please pray as we make all the necessary preparations to get ourselves and our belongings back home.

Where are we going next? The remainder of our home ministry assignment this year will include church visits in North Carolina, South Carolina, and Florida. We will then be staying in North Carolina for the remainder of the year to celebrate the holidays with our family for the first time in five years.

On Friday mornings, 6:45 AM, several men gather at Doug Wicker's home for a time of food, fellowship, Bible Study, and prayer. Pastor Seth leads an interactive study (currently *2 Peter*). Email Doug to be added to the weekly reminder.
